As an editor it was a real joy to take the work that was submitted and play with it in a way that both honoured the original intent of the pieces while still placing them in new and unexpected contexts. Some pieces were submitted as single frames, others were submitted as full-page comics. The full-page comics were dissected and broken down into individual frames and spaced throughout the novel to allow for a more seamless and cohesive collaboration. While working on this project I tried to work with as little foresight as possible. Some pages I approached with only a visual aesthetic in mind and some I approached with whatever abstract narrative seemed to be forming. In this way I was both a conduit for the collaboration, as well as the very first reader. I'd like to extend an enormous THANK YOU to each of the contributors for allowing me this opportunity, for being so open to this collaboration, and for continuing to create such strange and wonderful works of art.
