## MANHATTAN N.Y. MAP GUIDE

The buildings listed represent all periods of New York architecture. In many cases the notion of significant building or "monument" is an unfortunate format to adhere to, and a portion of a street or an area of several blocks is listed. Many buildings which are of historic interest only have not been listed. Certain new buildings, which have replaced significant works of architecture, have been purposefully omitted. Also commissions for interiors only, such as shops, banks, and showrooms have not been included.
